1. (10 pts) Explain the role of HTML vs. the role of HTTP. (It is helpful, but not sufficient to tell me what the letters stand for. What I really need to see is the role that each one plays in a web application.)

2. (10 pts) An HTTP request stream includes exactly one “HTTP Method”. List at least two HTTP methods, and briefly describe the circumstances under which each might be used.

3. (15 pts) For each of the following, circle GET, POST or both, and then *explain your answer*.

GET POST A user is submitting a username and password

GET POST A user submits a course number and semester (e.g. Fall 2005) to see how many open seats are in a class.

GET POST A user submits a text box containing their comments about their hotel stay. The box has room for about 10 lines of text.

4. (10 pts) Write a brief web page that illustrates the proper use of the following tags. The web page should include an input fields for “name” and “email address”, and a submit button. The page should submit a form to a servlet called “addToList.do” using the POST method. Add attributes to the tags as needed. (Before you start, take a look at the following question also.)
