Prof. Hilfbar thinks some more

Prof. Hilfbar realizes that he has access to student's schedules through his faculty access to the SIS+ system (Student Information System). However, he can't automate the process of getting their schedules into any other form (say, a text file) and for security and bureaucratic reasons, he can't just access the IBM databases directly. He'd have to go through one at a time and "cut and paste" from an IBM terminal session into a file, and that is prohibitively tedious.

Besides, there are other kinds of legitimate conflicts students might have with his review sessions other than scheduled classes: sports team practice, band practice, clubs, other professors informal review sessions, tutoring sessions, work conflicts, etc. He realizes that the students will have to provide that information themselves, so they might as well be the ones to provide their class schedules as well.
