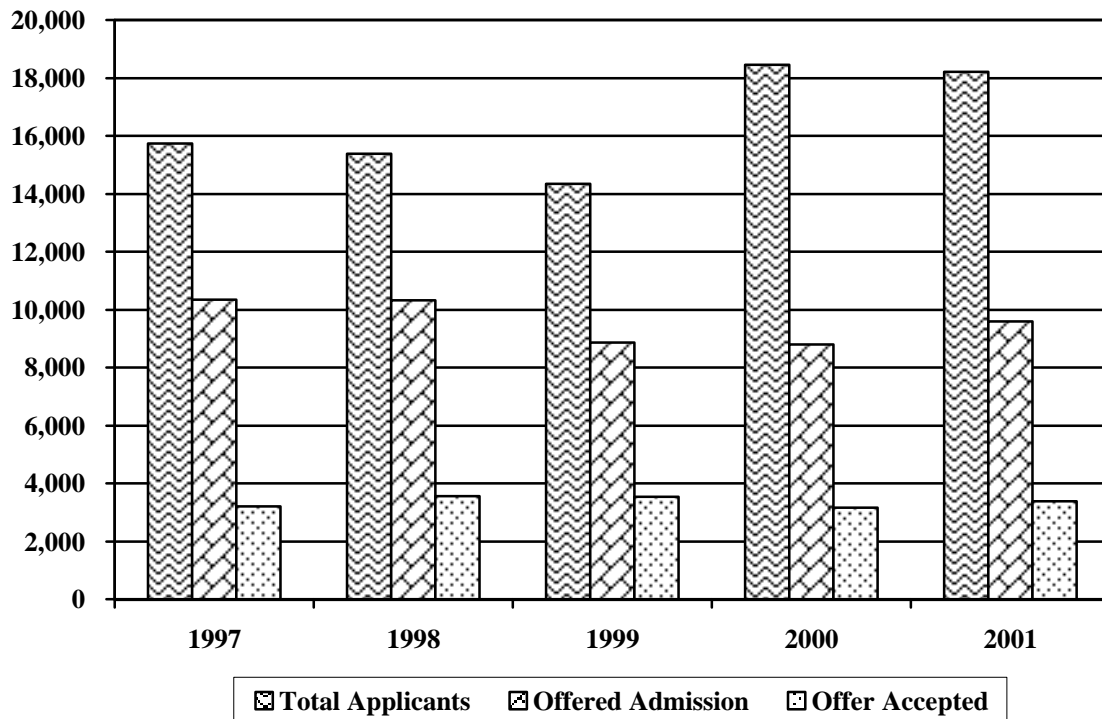

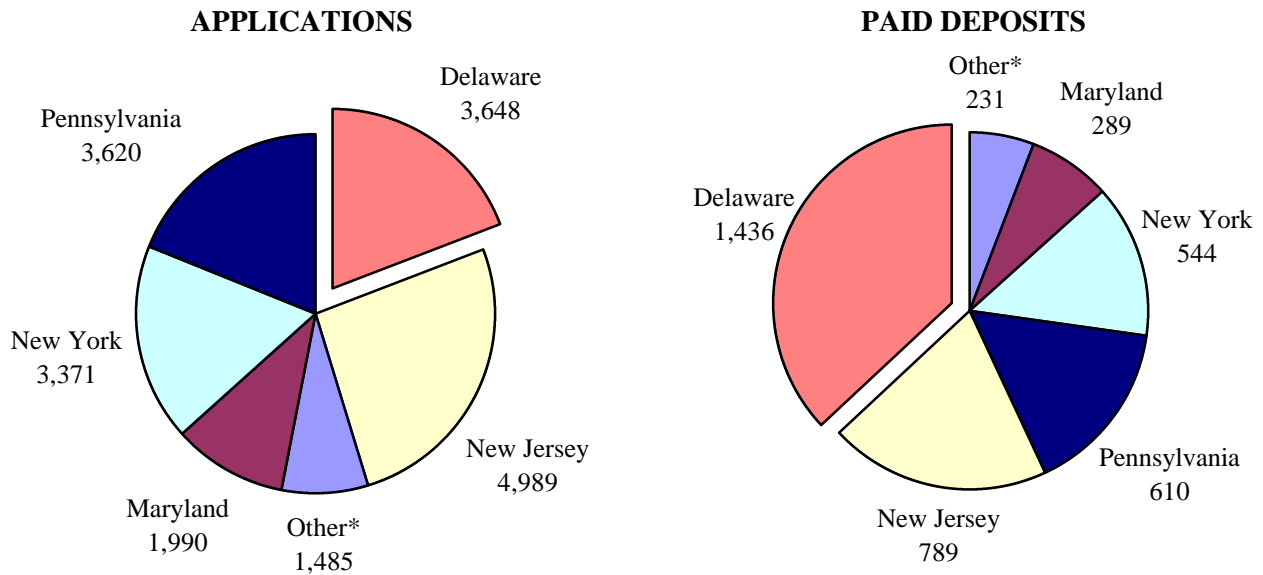

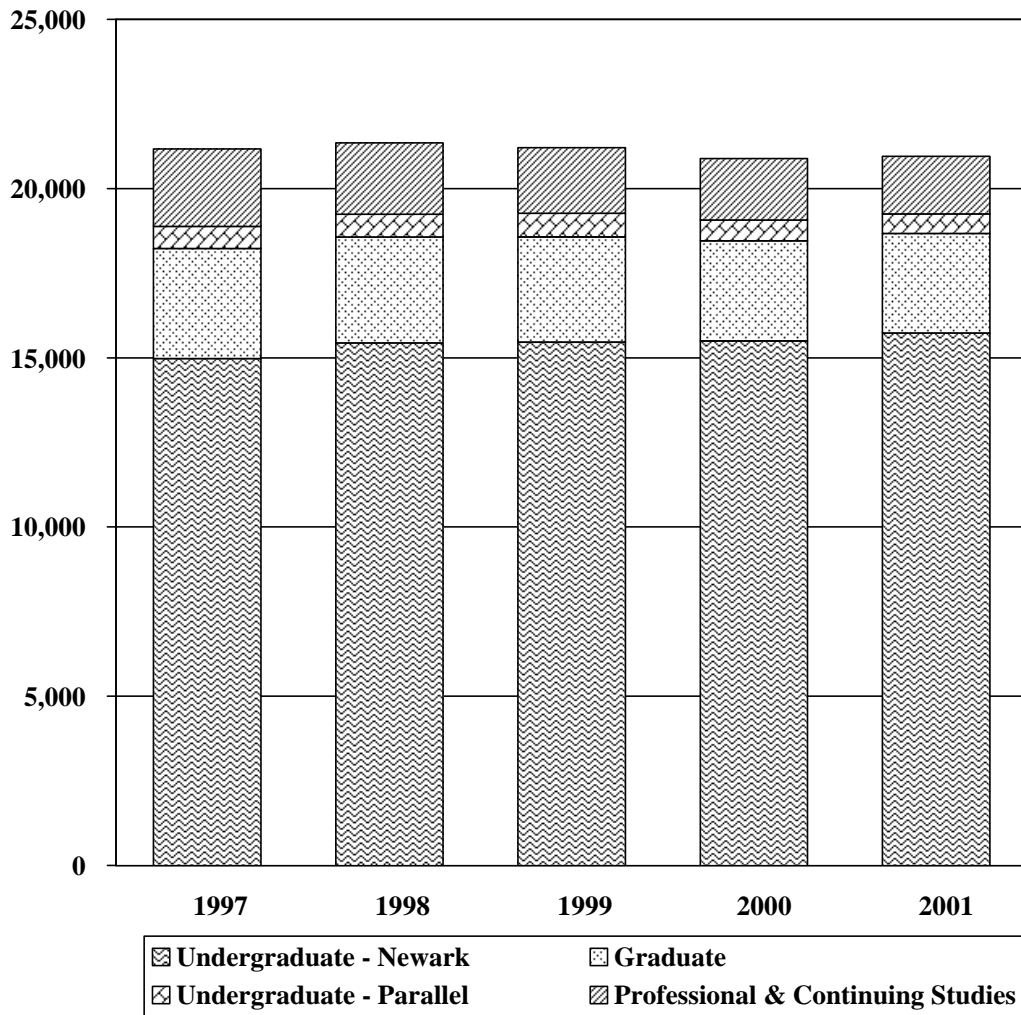

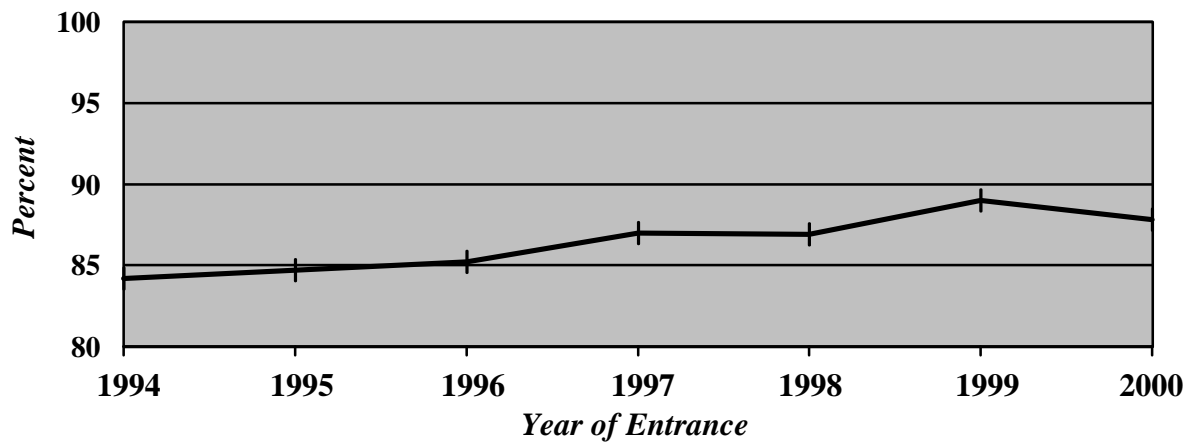

TRENDS IN FRESHMAN TO SOPHOMORE YEAR RETENTION

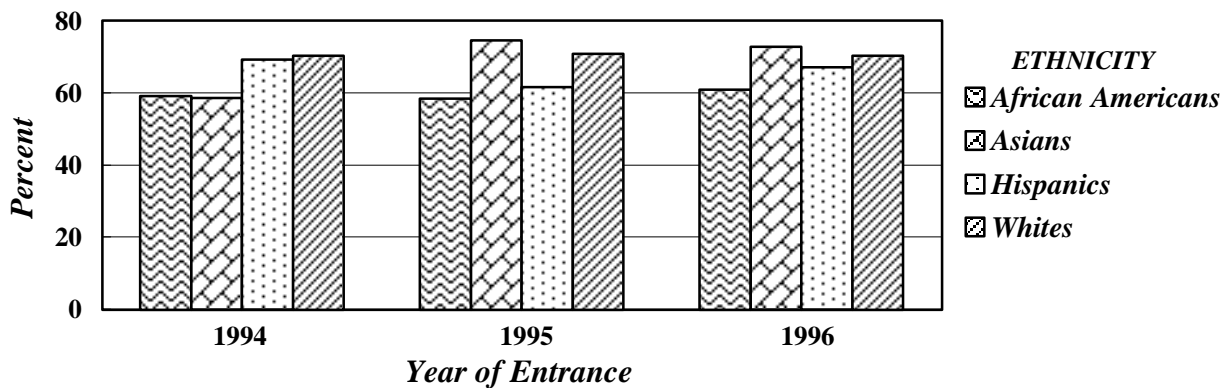
