

Silvia Nagy-Zekmi, Villanova University

Silvia Nagy-Zekmi is professor of Hispanic and Cultural Studies and the director of the Center for Arab and Islamic Studies at Villanova University in Philadelphia. Her books include *Paralelismos transatlánticos: poscolonialidad y narrativa femenina en América Latina y África del Norte* (1996). She has edited several volumes including *Moros en la costa: orientalismo en Latinoamérica* (Vervuert/ Iberoamericana, 2008), *Paradoxical Citizenship: Edward Said* (2006, 2008), *Democracy in Chile: The Legacy of September 11, 1973* (2005 Arthur Whitaker Prize), *Le Maghreb Poscolonial* (2003). She is currently working on a manuscript titled *The Poscolonial Condition: Representations of Nationhood, Ethnicity and Identity in Latin America* (forthcoming in Rodopi, Amsterdam) and is co-editing two volumes with Chantal Zabus, *Perennial Empire and Empire Building Yesterday and Tomorrow*.

Among her most important works are *La historia de cada día* (2002) and *Lavanderas en el tiempo* (2003).
