10:00-11:00 We will silently read and listen to a professional reading of the German traslation of Coelho's *The Alchemist* (<u>Portuguese</u>: O Alquimista). It is a novel by Brazilian author <u>Paulo Coelho</u> which was first published in 1988. Originally written in <u>Portuguese</u>, it has been translated into over 70 languages. It is an <u>allegorical</u> novel which follows a young <u>Andalusian</u> shepherd in his journey to <u>Egypt</u>, after having a recurring dream of finding treasure there. The book is an international bestseller. It has sold over 150 million copies in over 70 different languages becoming one of the <u>best-selling books in history</u> and setting the <u>Guinness World Record</u> for most translated book by a living author.

11:00-12:00 Film-TV-Unterhaltung. We will watch news broadcasts from Berlin, short films and videos that are both entertaining and informative which we can discuss. Most appropriate for those from the middle levels of German abilities through near fluency to native speakers. The news broadcasts are in German without English subtitles, the films are in German some with German subtitles and the discussion is in German and English.
