



Department of Medical Technology Tenure-Track Professor (Open Rank) Appointment effective September 1, 2011

The Department of Medical Technology at the University of Delaware invites nominations and applications for a tenure-track position at assistant, associate, or full-professor rank. We seek a clinical scientist with strong research training and a commitment to undergraduate and graduate education. Earned doctorate, national certification in clinical laboratory science, post-doctoral experience, and evidence of ability to conduct funded research are required. Successful experience in classroom and laboratory instruction preferred. Primary responsibilities will include conducting nationally visible, funded research, teaching undergraduate courses in medical technology, advising students, and participating in the development of a new Ph.D. program in Biomedical Sciences.

The Department of Medical Technology (<http://www.udel.edu/medtech/>) includes 10 faculty and professionals and approximately 120 undergraduate student majors. The department is part of the College of Health Sciences, which also includes the departments of Behavioral Health and Nutrition, Kinesiology & Applied Physiology, and Physical Therapy, and the School of Nursing. The college is poised to establish an exciting new comprehensive clinical research complex on a recently acquired 272-acre tract of university property (<http://www.udel.edu/udaily/2010/nov/chrysler112309.html>) that is slated for joint development as a research and technology campus by the university and our health science alliance partners <http://www.delawarehsa.org/>.

Founded in 1743, the University of Delaware combines tradition and innovation, offering students a rich heritage along with the latest in instructional and research technology. Located in scenic Newark, Delaware, within 2 hours of New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, and Washington, D.C., the University is a state-assisted, privately governed institution. One of the oldest land-grant institutions in the nation, one of 19 sea-grant institutions, and one of only 13 space-grant institutions, the University has nationally recognized research (Carnegie rated, very high research activity) and educational programs supported by state-of-the-art facilities and an expansive library.
