Baccalaureate graduates of accredited colleges are eligible to apply to the University of Delaware for admission to a degree program. Entrance requirements are established by the individual departments or graduate programs under guidelines established by the University faculty. Admission to graduate programs at the University of Delaware is selective and competitive based on the number of well-qualified applicants and the limits of available faculty and facilities. Those who meet stated minimum academic requirements are not guaranteed admission, nor are those who fail to meet those requirements necessarily precluded from admission if they offer other appropriate strengths.

### **Application Instructions**

The Office of Graduate Studies expects applicants to send all application materials together in one application packet to the Office of Graduate Studies. Applicants are encouraged to apply online at <a href="https://www.udel.edu/gradapply">www.udel.edu/gradapply</a> rather than using this paper application. (Only applicants applying online have the option of paying the application fee with a credit card.)

**DIRECTIONS:** Mail your application packet to the Office of Graduate Studies, 234 Hullihen Hall, University of Delaware, Newark, DE 19716-1501, USA. Please do not send your application to a departmental office as that will slow down the process of the review of your application. The application packet should include the following:

- A Cover Sheet that includes your full name, date of birth and the name of the program to which you have applied and the degree you wish to pursue. (Note: If you are requesting permission to enter the University as a non-degree visiting student, indicate this and the subject area of interest.)
- Completed paper application (answer all of the questions even if answered on resumé).
- Application fee in U.S. dollars is \$60 (U.S. currency) to be paid in the form of a check or money order payable to the University of Delaware. Applications received without the application fee will not be processed.
- 4. One official transcript of all U.S. college records in a sealed envelope provided by the U.S. institution. Applicants who have attended the University of Delaware do not need to send a transcript from the University of Delaware. Applicants who have attended institutions of higher education outside of the United States, please see insert on Additional Instructions for Foreign Applicants.
- 5. Three letters of recommendation in sealed envelopes.
- 6. Resumé.
- Statement of Objectives and Interests. Each essay must begin on a separate sheet of paper. See page 2 of the application for specific questions to answer.
- 8. Some departments require additional documents. Please refer to the individual program web sites at <a href="https://www.udel.edu/gradoffice/applicants/degreesmajors.html">www.udel.edu/gradoffice/applicants/degreesmajors.html</a> for this information.

9. Applicants should request Educational Testing Services (ETS) to report official GRE test scores (including Subject Test Scores, if required) or GMAT test scores and TOEFL test scores directly to the University of Delaware. The University of Delaware's institution code is 5811. We encourage applicants to submit photocopies of test scores in their application packet. The photocopies will not be considered official until official scores are presented directly from ETS.

### **Tuition Charges**

Tuition charges vary depending on whether one is a Delaware resident or a resident of another state or country. For the definition of Delaware residency, refer to the pamphlet, "Regulations Governing the Classification of Students at the University of Delaware," which is available by contacting the Student Services Building at (302) 831-8991. To be reviewed for and/or claim Delaware residency, applicants must complete the "Statement of Residence" part of this application.

#### Assistantships, Fellowships and Loans

Full-time graduate students are eligible to apply for assistantships, fellowships and tuition scholarships. Application for these awards is part of the admission application. Most departments require that application for admission and assistantships/fellowships be done by February 1st. All U.S. citizens must file a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) application by February 1st. A FAFSA form is required if a U.S. citizen is seeking a fellowship, assistantship, a Perkins Loan, a Stafford Loan, or College Work Study. FAFSA application regulations and form can be found on the web at fafsa.ed.gov.

### **Immunization Requirements**

It is a Delaware State Board of Health regulation and a University of Delaware mandate that **all** graduate students with a birth date after January 1, 1957, be immunized for measles, mumps and rubella (MMR). Also, students may be required to provide evidence of PPD (Mantoux) Tuberculosis Screening Test within 6 months prior to beginning classes. Students who are admitted beginning January 2002 are required to show proof of vaccination against meningococcal disease unless granted a waiver.

### **Application Deadline**

The general University deadline for applying for admission in the Spring semester is December 1; for admission in Summer is April 1; and for admission in Fall is July 1. However, the University of Delaware permits graduate programs to set earlier application deadlines.

Note: Most departments require that if an applicant desires to be considered for an assistantship or fellowship, the application should be submitted by February 1st.
