- a. Unintended consequences of sankin-kôtai.
- b. Problems provisioning Edo
- c. Commercialization complicates governing and taxation
- d. Theoretical class order undermined

## 2. The Tenpô Famine of the 1830s

- a. Mostly in northeast, but affected all of Japan
- b. Bakufu response inadequate

# 3. Increasing peasant riots (ikki)

- a. Usually for tax and/or rice relief
- b. Samurai now become involved

#### 4. Ôshio Heihachirô's Revolt, 1837

- a. In response to growing poverty in Osaka
- b. Oshio's summons to revolt; put down but 25% set ablaze

#### 5. Domainal reforms: Satsuma, Chôshû, and Mito

- a. Satsuma
- b. Chôshû
- c. Mito
  - Role as sanke (collateral branch family)
  - Tokugawa Nariaki and Mitogaku (Mito Studies)
  - Rangaku ("Dutch Studies")
