Needs of the Environmental Science Program with respect to our methods courses have been carefully considered and included in the discussion. (Geography is the administrative department for Environmental Science, and the submitter of this proposal is also the Director of the Environmental Science Program, so no separate approval has been considered necessary.)

Rationale:

The general form of the Geography major has remained steady for more than 20 years: students acquire introductory background in human geography, physical geography, and geographic methods, and then take advanced courses that may be focused on their primary interest. Over this time, the advances in computing that have influenced many fields have also transformed geographic methods. Formerly separate areas of spatial statistics and spatial data analysis, remote sensing air photo analysis, and cartography have partially converged in their technical usage. We now teach our students (and others across the university) a combination of programming, data handling, and computer mapping that falls under the general category of Geographic Information Systems (GIS). The current proposed revisions are primarily driven by a need to provide more training in GIS to our students without unduly removing the topical content from the major.

Over the past decade, we have developed an informally labeled "GIS sequence" within the department consisting of three courses: a data analysis and programming course (GEOG 250), a basic GIS course (GEOG 372) and an advanced GIS course (GEOG 471). The majority of our undergraduate majors now complete this sequence, and nearly every Geography major takes the first two at least. However, only one course from the sequence (GEOG 250) currently fills an introductory methods requirement, and that course is one of a choice of options for that requirement, so it is possible to leave the program with no training in GIS. In the view of the Geography

faculty, it is no longer tenable to send Geography majors out into the world (or to Geography graduate programs) without GIS training, and this training should consist of at least two courses, with a preference for taking all three courses. We therefore are proposing that two courses: a programming and data analysis course and a basic GIS course, become requirements for the major, and that the courses and schedules will be structured so that every student will have room within the program to take the third, advanced GIS courses. The introductory data analysis and programming course currently in the sequence, GEOG 250, serves several different functions within our department and for the Environmental Science major. A new course, GEOG 271, more directly tied to introducing the GIS sequence, has been proposed as an alternative to GEOG 250, while GEOG 250 remains a core requirement for the Environmental Science major and an alternative for Geography majors with strong interests in certain aspects of physical geography. Maintaining a GIS track which can alternatively begin with GEOG 250 assists the Environmental Science major, which also includes the GIS track within its electives.

A second change in the major is to raise the status of GEOG 445 Method and Theory in Geography to be a requirement. GEOG 445 has always served as the "capstone" course for the major, as well as satisfying the Arts and Sciences secondwriting-course requirement.

We have taken this opportunity to trim the introductory human and physical geography course lists in a way that ensures our graduates will have at least an introductory background in the entire range of the discipline. Because of the additional requirements, we have raised the total number of credits required to the major from 30 to 35. With the expanded popularity of our technical and methods courses, it has been possible to complete the 30-credit major without taking any upper-division Geography courses in traditional topical content areas.

This set of revisions was developed by a committee of Geography faculty and was approved by the entire faculty of the Geography Department on 22 September 2005.

The overall design of the minor is unchanged: three courses selected one-from-each of three introductory groups (physical geography, human geography, and methods), and three more courses from the 300 level and above. Previous introductory-course lists for the minor have been the same as introductory-course lists for the BA majors, and this revision modifies the minor in parallel with proposed changes in our BA majors. A slight variation from the majors' course lists is that we did not choose to require students in the minor to take the 4-credit lab versions of our courses, so GEOG 101 is listed without its 111 lab and GEOG 220 Meteorology is returned to the list.
